1. Welcome

Sprint Navigation™ uses GPS position determination technology and access to Sprint's data network to provide you with driving directions and a host of other services, including:

- GPS navigation that gives you turn-by-turn directions to any destination address in the continental
 United States. If you miss a turn or get off-track, Sprint Navigation will calculate a new route for you.
 You can enter a destination address by using Sprint Navigation's automatic voice recognition system
 or by typing on the phone's keypad.
- Audio and visual traffic alerts while driving or viewing maps, as well as traffic rerouting capabilities to minimize delays on your trip.
- A Directory feature that allows you to find businesses or points of interest near your current location, near an airport, near a waypoint, or near any other entered address. You can easily call the business that you have found to check on the availability of an item or to make a reservation. You can navigate to the business location now or save the address for later use.
- Maps of the area around your current location, around a marked favorite, or around an address that
 you had previously entered. You can pan the map (adjust left, right, up, or down) and zoom in or out.
- The ability to personalize your application preferences by selecting U.S. customary or metric distance units, the language for audible guidance, and so on.
- A compass-like indicator presenting your direction of travel, location, and speed.
- You can also use many of Sprint Navigation's features on the Sprint Navigation website, like getting
 driving directions (Route Planning) and using the Directory to find businesses, churches, schools, and
 government offices. You can also use the Sprint Navigation website to add an address to your My
 Favorites list and manage your My Favorites and Recent Places lists.

2. Safety and Legal Notices

Please read this section carefully before using Sprint Navigation

Sprint and TeleNav will not accept any responsibility whatsoever for accidents resulting from failure to observe common sense precautions. Your personal judgment, traffic regulations, and common sense must always take precedence over any driving direction produced by Sprint Navigation.

WARNING: Keep your eyes on the road.

It is your responsibility as the vehicle operator to keep your eyes on the road and be an alert driver at all times, ESPECIALLY when the vehicle is moving. The vehicle operator should not be distracted by the application displays, by audible cues, or by manually interacting with the controls. When you need to enter data on your phone using the keypad or study the display, only do so while the vehicle is parked, not while the vehicle is in motion. Turn off your phone if your ability to drive responsibly is decreased by using the Sprint Navigation application.

WARNING: Install the equipment safely.

If you are using a phone mounting kit, make sure that it does not obstruct your vision. You may wish to charge the phone while using Sprint Navigation. If so, make sure that the charging cable does not interfere with any of the vehicle's controls.

WARNING: Drive safely and use common sense.

The vehicle operator's personal judgment, traffic regulations, and common sense must always take precedence over the instructions provided by Sprint Navigation.

It is your responsibility as the vehicle operator to drive safely, observe all traffic rules, and use your own personal judgment while driving. If you feel that a route suggested by the navigation software instructs you to perform an unsafe or illegal maneuver, places you in an unsafe situation, or routes you into an area that you consider to be unsafe, do not follow the navigation instructions.

3. Data Service Options

The Sprint Navigation application that you install on your phone requires a means of accessing the public Internet, which is typically provided by Sprint's data network.

Sprint Navigation communicates with the Sprint Navigation servers to get routing, maps, and points of interest via Sprint's data network. You do not need to purchase additional data services if you already have a data or email services plan for your phone. However, if you do not already have a data or email services plan, you must order one from Sprint so you can use the Sprint Navigation application.

4. The Phone Controls

The following keys on your phone are referenced in this manual as follows. Note that the placement of the keys may vary, depending on your phone model.

Left softkey The key in the upper left corner of the keypad.

The left softkey performs the function directly above it on the menu bar at the bottom of the screen. The left softkey is typically used to go **Back** one screen, **Close** a screen, or **Exit** the application. In the illustration below, the left softkey takes you back to the previous screen (the Sprint Navigation Main Menu).



Right softkey

The key in the upper right corner of the keypad. The right softkey performs the function directly above it on the menu bar at the bottom of the screen.

The right softkey is typically used as **Yes** or **Go** (usually the same as pressing the **OK** button), although sometimes it opens a special menu or puts the keypad in a different mode. For example, the right softkey switches you between alpha and numeric modes when you type information in a text field. In the illustration above, the right softkey executes the **Go** command and takes you to the My Favorites screen.



Back button

The **Back** button is located below the right softkey. For consistency throughout the Sprint Navigation application, consider using the left softkey instead of the **Back** button to go back to the previous screen. The **Back** button is normally only used to delete entries in a text field.

OK button

The **Menu/OK** button in the center of the circular navigation key.

Navigation keys

The circular navigation key that surrounds the **OK** button. The navigation key has four possible choices—left, right, up, and down. These are referred to as the left navigation key, the right navigation key, the up navigation key, and the down navigation key.

END key

The **END** key returns you to the Sprint Main Menu (Preview). Pressing and holding the **END** key turns off the phone.



5. Installing Sprint Navigation

There are two different ways that you can install the application:

Method A

- 1. Navigate to the Sprint Main Menu.
- 2. Select the Web icon.
- 3. Scroll down to the Search box and enter "nav."
- 4. Click Search button.
- 5. In the search results, click on Sprint Navigation and follow instructions to download.
- 6. When prompted for Network Access or GPS Access, select the setting that best fits your needs. Most users select "Always Allow" for ease of use.
- 7. Press the **END** key once to return to the Sprint Preview screen after installing the Sprint Navigation application.

NOTE: Holding down the **END** key too long will shut off the phone.

Method B

- 1. Navigate to the Sprint Main Menu.
- 2. Select the My Contents icon.
- Select Applications.
- 4. Select Get New.
- 5. Select the Category "GPS: Navigate, Search & More."

- 6. Select the Category "GPS Navigation."
- 7. Click on Sprint Navigation and follow instructions to download.
- 8. When prompted for Network Access or GPS Access, select the setting that best fits your needs. Most users select "Always Allow" for ease of use.
- 9. Press the **END** key once to return to the Sprint Preview screen after installing the Sprint Navigation application.

NOTE: Holding down the **END** key too long will shut off the phone.

6. Removing Sprint Navigation

To remove the Sprint Navigation application from your phone, do the following steps:

- 1. Navigate to the Sprint Preview screen.
- Select the My Contents icon.
- Select Applications.
- 4. Select the Sprint Navigation application.
- 5. Select Options by using the right softkey.
- Select All.
- 7. Select Erase.
- 8. Confirm that you want to delete the application in the Warning screen.

NOTE: You must call Sprint to cancel your subscription.

7. Launching Sprint Navigation

To launch the Sprint Navigation application on your phone, do the following steps:

- 1. Turn on your phone.
- 2. Select the Main Menu icon when the Preview screen appears.

NOTE: If you are doing another function on your phone and want to go to the Preview screen so you can launch Sprint Navigation, press the **END** key once. As mentioned earlier, if you hold the **END** key down too long, it may shut off the phone.


- Select the My Content icon.
- 4. Select Applications in the My Content menu.

- 5. Select Sprint Navigation.
- 6. The Sprint Navigation splash screen appears.
 - If you have signed up for a data plan that gives you unlimited monthly access, you will go straight to the Warning screen (see next step).
 - If you have not signed up for a data plan that gives you
 unlimited monthly access, you will see a screen informing you
 that you have a one-day free trial. Clicking the **Begin free trial**option allows you to use the application for 24 hours from when
 you started (time is accrued even if you exit the application).
 You will go to the Warning screen after you accept the free trial.
- 7. The following message appears: "Turn on your phone's speaker if possible."

Turn on the speaker if it is not already on. Then select the **OK** button and wait as the application downloads.

8. A warning message appears with a message similar to the following:

"Do not maneuver this application while driving. You assume all risks of using this application in your vehicle."

Press the left softkey to reject this warning and exit application startup, or press the right softkey to accept this warning and start Sprint Navigation.



9. The Sprint Navigation Main Menu appears.



Upgrade from Free Trial

If you do not have an unlimited-access monthly plan, you can only use the Sprint Navigation application for a brief trial period. When you launch the application again after you accept your trial period, you will either see a screen telling you how much time you have left, or a screen telling you your trial has expired.

When your trial has expired, you will need to purchase a plan. You can continue using Sprint Navigation on a daily basis, or you can contact Sprint Navigation Customer Support to purchase unlimited-access monthly plans. If you purchase a daily plan from your handset or have contacted a Sprint Customer Representative to purchase a monthly recurring plan, you will see the charges on your Sprint monthly bill.

NOTE: Clicking **Confirm Purchase** on the purchasing screen is irrevocable; once you confirm your purchase, you will be billed the amount you owe.

Drive To Menu





The Drive To Menu options are:

- **My Favorites** Favorite places that you have found and saved in the past so you can quickly search for them. Your My Favorites list can grow to an unlimited length.
- Recent Places Sprint Navigation automatically saves all of the places that you:
 - -Found in a Directory search.
 - -Viewed as a map.
 - -Located using a street address, intersection, city, or airport.

NOTE: You can get directions to a Recent Place, view maps of the Recent Place, or save a Recent Place to your My Favorites list. Your Recent Places list can grow to an unlimited length.

- Addresses Enter a street address by typing or speaking. You can get directions, view a map of
 the address, or save the address to your My Favorites list. The address is automatically saved to
 your Recent Places list.
- Intersection Enter an intersection by typing or speaking. You can get directions, view a map of
 the intersection, or save the intersection to your My Favorites list. The intersection is automatically
 saved to your Recent Places list.
- **City** Enter a name of a city. You can get directions, view a map of the city, or save the city to your My Favorites list. The city is automatically saved to your Recent Places list.
- Directory Search the Directory and find the addresses and phone numbers of businesses such as
 restaurants, motels, and gas stations, as well as other places such as churches, schools,
 government offices, and police and fire stations.

NOTE: Once you find what you are looking for, you can get audible and visual driving or walking directions, place a call, view a map, or save it to your My Favorites list. The Directory search result is automatically saved to your Recent Places list.

Airports - Quickly find airports. You can get driving directions to an airport, view a map, or save the
airport information to your My Favorites list. The airport is automatically saved to your Recent
Places list.

Directory Menu





The Directory menu provides you with a few different ways to find the addresses and phone numbers of businesses such as restaurants, motels, and gas stations, as well as other places such as churches, schools, government offices, and police and fire stations.

Once you find what you are looking for, you can get audible and visual driving or walking directions, view a map of the location, or save the location to your My Favorites list. You can also place a call to make reservations.

The result of every search is automatically saved to your Recent Places list. If you don't have time to save the result of your Directory search to your My Favorites list, you can easily go into your Recent Places list later and save the location to your My Favorites list.

9. Using Sprint Navigation

You can use Sprint Navigation for many business and personal functions, including:

- Finding businesses, churches, schools, government offices, police and fire stations, etc.
- Getting audible and visual driving directions to virtually anywhere in the United States within a Sprint coverage area.
- Making reservations at restaurants, motels, and hotels.
- As a replacement for paper maps.
- As a personal information manager to keep a My Favorites list of places that you've visited or called.
- To view traffic information for a certain area or route.

For example, you can use Sprint Navigation to find a motel, save the motel's location to your My Favorites list so you can easily find it again later, call it and make reservations, then get audible turn-by-turn and visual directions to the motel.

You can also search for a particular type of business closest to your current location or closest to another location. For example, you could search for a Mexican restaurant closest to your current location or closest to the motel at which you just made reservations.

In addition, you can also search for locations along your route. For example, you can search for all of the gas stations that sell your favorite brand of gas on your route between Dallas and Houston.





My Favorites

In the My Favorites screen, press the down navigation key until you highlight your desired location. Then press the **OK** button.

Your My Favorites list can grow to an unlimited length. If your My Favorites list gets very large, it may be easier to use the Find function to find your desired Favorite. To use the Find function, enter one or more alphanumeric characters in the Find text box. Then press the **OK** button.

You have four options when you select a Favorite: 1.) Drive To (to get driving directions to this location), 2.) View Map (to view a map of this location), 3.) Rename the Favorite, or 4.) Delete the Favorite.

Recent Places

In the Recent Places screen, press the down navigation key until you highlight your desired location. Then press the **OK** button to go to the Address screen for this location.

You have four options from the Address screen: 1.) Drive To (to get driving directions to this location), 2.) View Map (to view a map of this location),

- 3.) Save To Favorites (save this Recent Place to your My Favorites list), or
- 4.) Delete (delete this Recent Place from your Recent Places list).

Selecting Drive To from the Address screen takes you to the Directions screen.

Your Recent Places list can grow to an unlimited length. If you have a large Recent Places list, it may be easier to use the Find function to find your desired Recent Place. To use the Find function, enter one or more alphanumeric characters in the Find text box. Then press the **OK** button.

Enter a street address by typing in the appropriate fields as shown above. Then press the **OK** button twice. Partial entry (5 or more letters) is okay for the street name. After your location appears, you have three options: 1.) Drive To (get directions), 2.) Save to Favorites (save the address to your My Favorites list), or 3.) View a Map of the address. You can also enter an address by speaking (see page **33**).

Sprint Navigation checks to see if the address that you entered can be found. Sprint Navigation prompts you to modify the address if the address is too new to be found in the mapping database or if the street number cannot be found for some other reason (i.e., if the street number does not exist).

Intersection





Enter an intersection by typing as shown above and pressing the **OK** button twice. You can also enter an address by speaking (see page <u>33</u>).

Sprint Navigation checks to see if the intersection that you entered can be found. Sprint Navigation prompts you to modify the name of the intersection if one of the streets does not exist, if the streets do not cross, or if the address is too new to be found in the mapping database.

You have three options when you select an intersection: 1.) Drive To (get directions), 2.) Save to Favorites (save the address to your My Favorites list), or 3.) View a Map of the address.

City

Type the name of a city in the City field. The City field has an auto-fill feature, so you usually will not have to type the whole name of the city or the name of the state. If the city that you are looking for appears in the drop-down list box under the text field, you can press the down navigation key until you highlight the desired city and then press the **OK** button.

If you have to type the whole name of the city, do so in the City field and press the **OK** button. Press the down navigation key to place the cursor into the State field that appears. Type the two-letter abbreviation for the state if you know it, or spell the whole name of the state if you do not. Then press the **OK** button. Press the down navigation key to highlight Done and then press the **OK** button.

You have three options after you select a city: 1.) Drive To (get directions),

- 2.) Save to Favorites (save the address to your My Favorites list), or
- 3.) View a Map of the address.



Businesses

Navigate to your desired location in the Directory and then press the **OK** button to select it.

You have four options when you select a desired location: 1.) Drive To (get directions), 2.) Call the location, 3.) Save to Favorites (save the address to your My Favorites list), or 4.) View a Map of the address.



Airports

Type the three-letter abbreviation of the airport, or type the whole name of the airport > press the **OK** button > press the down navigation key to highlight Done > press the **OK** button.

If a drop-down list appears with the name of the airport, you may be able to save time and keystrokes by pressing the down navigation key to highlight the name of the desired airport and then pressing the **OK** button.

You have three options after you select an airport: 1.) Drive To (get directions), 2.) Save to Favorites (save the address to your My Favorites list), or 3.) View a Map of the address.

NOTE: If you are not sure of the street that you are on, simply start driving. Sprint Navigation will revise its estimate of your location and provide you with a new route if needed.



Initial Driving Directions

Within a few seconds of selecting a Drive To location, Sprint Navigation calculates what it believes to be an optimal route to your destination and tells you how to start your trip from your current location.

If you are not moving, Sprint Navigation may not know your direction of travel, so the first few driving directions may be incorrect since Sprint Navigation may initially make an incorrect assumption. However, once you start moving, Sprint Navigation learns your direction of travel and provides an updated set of driving directions.

GPS Origin Refinement

If you are using GPS navigation and you are in a parking lot or similar area where your location does not exactly map to a specific street, you may see a pop-up that shows Sprint Navigation's best estimate of which street you are on. This gives you the opportunity to change the starting street.

If you elect to change the starting street, a list of neighboring streets appears, and you can make an alternate selection from the list. If you do nothing, the first pop-up disappears after a few seconds, and Sprint Navigation uses the default street as the starting location.

If you are not sure which street you are on, simply start driving. Sprint Navigation detects your current location and recalculates your driving directions as needed.

Audible Guidance Tones

Sprint Navigation application delivers audible guidance tones (beeps with a recognizable pitch) as you drive in addition to spoken audible directions. A preparatory audible tone is typically heard no less than 30 seconds before reaching a turn, and an action audible tone is typically heard no less than 10 seconds before reaching a turn. The preparatory audible tone may not be sounded if the distance to the next turn only allows time for the action tone.

The lead times for the audible guidance tones are increased proportionally to your driving speed. For example, this allows more time for changing lanes before a turn if you are driving at highway speeds as opposed to driving more slowly on local streets.

Miss a Turn?

Whenever you miss a turn, turn the wrong way, turn too early or too late, or otherwise get off the planned route to your destination, Sprint Navigation automatically creates a new route to your desired destination and an audible tone announces that a new set of instructions is available.

If you realize you have missed a turn or have otherwise gotten off the route, just keeping driving. Sprint Navigation detects your current location and recalculates a new set of driving directions to get you back on track.

It may take approximately 15 to 30 seconds for Sprint Navigation to update your route. If during this process you make additional deviations from your current route, Sprint Navigation may have to contact its servers for another new route.

Since Sprint Navigation requires access Sprint's network, if you are off route and outside of the carrier's coverage area, you must return to Sprint's coverage area in order for Sprint Navigation to recalculate your route.

Navigation Views

The default navigation view is 3D moving maps, but you may wish to use another option when you are navigating. Pull over and stop your vehicle in a safe place before changing navigation options. You may even wish to plan your trip before you start by looking at other navigation views.

You can access other navigation views after you start a navigation session, for example from the Drive To menu. Press the right softkey to select the View menu.



Use the up and down navigation keys in the View menu to select the desired navigation view. Then press the **OK** button.







When you are viewing moving maps during navigation, a Traffic Alert icon will appear at the bottom-right corner of the map if there is an accident less than 15 miles ahead of your current route and the Traffic Alerts preference is turned on. You will see the distance along the route until the accident and hear an audio warning.







If you click on an incident line, you can view the details. Below is an explanation of what you will see on the Traffic Detail screen:

- Delay The additional time it will take to travel the segment as compared with the time it would take if traveling at the posted speed.
- Travel Time Estimated time it will take to travel the segment.
- Slowest Speed Slowest speed observed on the segment.
- Average Speed Bar Average speed of a segment on a scale of 0 to the maximum-posted speed for that segment.
- Incident Detail Each incident is displayed with the following:



Search Along

Use the Directory to find the desired locations along your navigation route. For example, find every Mexican restaurant on your route between San Francisco and Sacramento. This also displays how many miles off your route each restaurant is. Select a restaurant from the Search Along list to get driving directions from your current location to the restaurant.

Navigation Options

After you select a Drive To location, the Directions screen appears. Sprint Navigation assumes that you want to start from your current location, but your can select the Edit Route option to change the Origin or the Destination of your trip.


Simply press the up or down navigation keys to halt the automatic Get Route function and the Edit Route menu item will be highlighted. Press the **OK** button or the right softkey to access the Edit Route menu.

NOTE: You can also get walking directions that may make your walking route easier, for example by allowing you to take advantage of going the wrong way down one way streets. As always, use your common sense to determine the safety of any route.

To get walking directions from any Directions screen select:

You can also modify the Route Style for your trip by selecting one of the following options:

- Fastest This default Route Style finds the fastest driving route.
- Traffic Optimized This Route Style finds the fastest route that minimizes current traffic delays.

- Prefer Streets Use streets instead of highways if possible.

Re-routing Options

Manual





- 6. The Suggested Route screen shows the proposed new route, outlining the original (blue) and suggested route (green), as well as listing the estimated time saved.
- 7. Click the right softkey to **ACCEPT** the new route and be taken back to your navigation session.



Avoid Ahead (audio detour)

When you hear an audio warning about a traffic incident during your navigation session, you can re-route to avoid congestion ahead.

8. During navigation, an audio warning sounds to alert you to traffic incidents along your route. An alert icon appears at the bottom-right corner of the map, showing severity and distance to the incident.

(Audio) "Accident 2.3 miles ahead on US 101 at Lawrence Expressway; 1 lane closed. Press '0' to avoid."

9. Press "0" on the handset. The "Getting New Route" progress bar appears, and the application automatically calculates a route to avoid all incidents within a 15-mile range. When you hear the audio prompt, "New Route," the new route will be shown on your navigation session. The traffic alert icon will disappear from the screen.

Enter a Drive To Address

In the Drive To Address and Drive To Intersection menus, you have the option to type in an address or speak an address.

Enter an Address by Typing

Typing an address or intersection is straightforward. See the User's Guide for your Sprint phone for information about how to enter numbers and letters.

HINT: To change back and forth from typing numbers to typing letters, press the right softkey.



The call is terminated and you are automatically returned to the Sprint Preview menu.

Launch Sprint Navigation on your phone as discussed on page 8.

From the Sprint Navigation Main Menu, select Drive To for driving directions, or select View Maps to view a map, then select the Recent Places option. The address you just entered using the voice address input system is at the top of your Recent Places list.






11. Directory Menu

You can use the Directory to find businesses, churches, schools, government offices, police and fire stations, and so on. To use the Directory do the following steps:



The Tools/Extras menu gives you options for setting your preferences and other features as described in the following sections.

Record Location

To save your current location to your My Favorites list, do the following steps:

Compass

This screen is similar to a nautical compass. It displays:

- The direction that you are heading in (if you are moving).
- Your latitude and longitude.
- If no GPS data is available, "No GPS" appears instead of the latitude and longitude.
 - -Latitude is represented as N for north or S for south. Longitude is represented as W for west or E for east.

Your speed in miles or kilometers per hour (select miles or kilometers in the Preferences menu as discussed below).



<u>Preferences</u>

You can set the following personal preferences in the Preferences menu. After you select your new preference, press the right softkey to save it.

- Route Type Fastest, Traffic Optimized, Shortest, Prefer Streets, Prefer Highway, or Pedestrian. The "Traffic Optimized" style will give a route that minimizes traffic delays.
- Traffic Alert On or Off. If this feature is on, audio and visual traffic alerts will appear on the 2D or 3D Moving Maps screen if there is a traffic incident on the route ahead.
- Distance Units Miles/feet or kilometers/meters.
- Moving Maps None (Turn Icons Only), 2D Moving Maps, or 3D Moving Maps.
- Audio Options Full Audio, Instructions Only, or No Audio.
- **Language** Determines the language used for audio prompts: English or Spanish.

- Help Card Help cards prompt you with hints or cautions about using various menu options. To clear a help card from the screen, press the OK button. The Help cards feature has the following three options:

14. Making a Phone Call from Sprint Navigation

Calling a location that you have found in the Directory like a restaurant, a hotel or a church is easy—simply select the Call menu item.

NOTE: Because your phone can only do one function at a time, making a call from a Sprint Navigation screen automatically exits the Sprint Navigation application. In order easily return to the location that you found, select the Save to My Favorites menu option before making your call. Restart Sprint Navigation after you finish your call and retrieve the location from your My Favorites list.



Taking an Incoming Call

When you are using Sprint Navigation and your phone receives an incoming call, your phone rings and displays a screen that gives you the option to take or ignore the call.

If you ignore the call, the Sprint GPS application resumes and continues with the function that you were using before the call came in. However, if you take the call, the Sprint Navigation application terminates because the phone can only run one application at a time.

After you finish the call, re-launch Sprint Navigation and begin again where you left off. For example, if you were driving to a location that wasn't saved to your My Favorites list, look in your Recent Places list. To get driving directions, simply select the destination in your Recent Places list and then select Drive To.

Change your PIN number

15. Interruption of Other Services

Whenever Sprint Navigation needs to contact its servers, it uses Sprint's data service. When Sprint Navigation uses Sprint's data service, other services such as SMS messaging and conventional cellular calls are not available. Typically, this interruption of other services lasts no more than 20 seconds or so.

When incoming calls are blocked due to Sprint Navigation's use of Sprint's data network, phone calls go to your voice mail if you have a voice mail service available.

16. Exiting Sprint Navigation

To exit the Sprint Navigation application, do the following steps:

- Press the End button, or
- If you are not at the Sprint Navigation Main Menu, press the left softkey until the Main Menu appears. Then press the left softkey once. In the "Exit Sprint Navigation now?" pop-up, press the right softkey to select **YES** and exit Sprint Navigation.

17. The Sprint Navigation Website

To access the Sprint Navigation Website, go to www.sprint.com/navigation and log in with your account number and PIN. The following features are available:

- Plan a trip by entering the starting and destination addresses (this does not update information on your phone).
- Find restaurants, motels, stores, churches, schools, government offices, and so on, including getting addresses, phone numbers, maps, and directions.
- Contact Customer Support.
- Add an address and save it to the My Favorites list on your phone. The next time you launch Sprint
 Navigation on your phone, the new address will appear in your My Favorites and Recent Places lists.

NOTE: If Sprint Navigation is running on your phone when you save the address on the Website, the new address will show up in your My Favorites list or your Recent Places list only if you have not accessed these lists in your current Sprint Navigation session. If you have already accessed one of these lists in your current session, the new address will not appear in these lists until you close and then re-launch Sprint Navigation.

- Manage addresses in your My Favorites and Recent Places lists (both of which update information on your phone). These lists can grow to an unlimited length.
- Update your personal information, including your home and work addresses and your email address.
- Change your PIN number.

18. Error Conditions

GPS Signal Weak

Move to an area with a clearer view of the sky.

Invalid Login

Your account number is your 10-digit mobile phone number beginning with area code. Your PIN is a 4-digit number that you assign. Your PIN can be accessed from the Contact option in Sprint Navigation Tools/Extras menu.

If for some reason you cannot access your PIN, contact Sprint Navigation Customer Care at 1-800-777-4681.

No GPS Data

Make sure that you have a good view of the open sky. Then exit and re-launch Sprint Navigation.

Please input phone number

You must provide your mobile telephone number to log into Sprint Navigation.

Sprint Navigation Encountered an Error

Sprint Navigation is having technical problems with the specific request that you made. This can be due to an address that it cannot find, or mapping data that does not allow routing from where you are to where you want to go. In this case, try to use a nearby address.

Sprint Navigation Not Available

If you get an advisory message that Sprint Navigation is not available, exit Sprint Navigation and then re-launch it. If the problem recurs, it may be due to a temporary Sprint Navigation server outage.

Trial Expired

The trial period for your account has expired. Order Sprint Navigation by calling Customer Support at 1-800-777-4681.

Unable to generate a route

Sprint Navigation could not generate a route between the two endpoints of the route. This may be a temporary error if you have a weak GPS signal when establishing the origin, but may be due to errors in the map data in the area around the destination.

19. FAQs

Why do I need the carrier's data service?

The data plan allows you to access nationwide routes, maps, and Directory content from the Sprint Navigation servers using the data communication features of your phone. These services are different from your cellular airtime. To order a data plan from Sprint, please contact their Customer Support directly:

Does Sprint Navigation use up my voice plan minutes?

Sprint Navigation uses data to provide its navigation functions. Using data does not use any of your voice minutes. However, calling the Voice Address Input System does use about 75 seconds per address entered. The Voice Call feature internal to the Sprint Navigation application also uses voice minutes.

How accurate is the GPS?

GPS accuracy can range from 20m (approx. 65 ft) to 100m (approx. 328 ft). Most of the time, the GPS is accurate to less than 50 meters (approx. 164 ft).

What is ideal GPS environment?

The GPS requires an open, clear view of the sky. Buildings, covered parking areas, tunnels, and dense foliage can cause the GPS receiver to be unable to locate a GPS satellite or may cause extended initialization time (time to first GPS fix).

If you are parked in a covered parking lot or near a tall building, it is recommended that you move into an open area and then begin to use the Sprint Navigation service.

Why does the GPS not work near buildings and other tall objects?

The GPS uses signals from satellites, so it needs a clear view of the sky. Tall buildings and other objects that block the GPS receiver's view to the sky may make it impossible to determine your location. Sometimes the satellites are not overhead but near the horizon; in these cases, the GPS receiver in your phone must have a clear view of the horizon.

How do I know that the GPS has a signal?

Sprint Navigation application alerts you if you do not have a valid GPS signal. If this happens, move to an area where there is a clear view of the sky so the GPS satellite signal has access to the GPS receiver in your phone.

What happens if I'm using Sprint Navigation for driving directions and I lose the GPS signal while driving across a bridge or through a tunnel or lose the GPS signal for some other reason?

Sprint Navigation remembers the speed at which you were driving before losing the GPS signal. Sprint Navigation continues to give you driving directions based on an estimate of the projected distance that you may have traveled at your last recorded rate of speed. Sprint Navigation recalculates your current position when you regain a GPS signal and adjusts your driving directions accordingly.

20. Sprint Navigation Customer Support
